Mineral Point - Clifford James Anderson, age 92, of Mineral Point, passed away on Thursday, November 19, 2020. He was born on November 3, 1928 to James and Lydia (Sieber) Anderson in Loves Park, Illinois.

In his youth, he moved numerous times in the Monroe, WI area and then to the Montfort and Cobb areas until they settled on a farm near Livingston, WI. He attended high school for two years in Cobb, WI and then graduated from Livingston High School in 1945.
