Hollandale – David L. Scott, age 89, of Hollandale, was granted his last wish as he drew his last breath in his own home on Tuesday, December 18, 2018.

David Scott, son of Charles and Julia (Kelly) Scott, was born on October 29, 1929. He was born in Madison, Wisconsin.
