Hollandale – Greg Parman, age 64, of Hollandale, passed away peacefully with family by his side on Thursday, May 7, 2020 at University Hospital in Madison from injuries sustained in a traffic accident.

He was born on August 7, 1955 in Dodgeville, the son of the late Jack and Colleen (Hogan) Parman. He graduated from Barneveld High School in 1973. On September 13, 1974, he married Catherine Lease in Mt. Horeb.
