Dodgeville – Laurence D. "Skip" Cloutier, age 88, of Dodgeville, left this crazy world on Wednesday, February 9, 2022 after a brief, non-Covid related illness.

Skippy was born on March 16, 1933 to Laurence W and Ida J (Carlson) Cloutier in Superior, WI. His humble beginnings in Superior were hard spent, the early death of his father left him to help his mom raise his little sister Jeanyne. He spent 4 years in the U.S. Navy during the Korean War as a parachute repairman.

Skip had a passion for the outdoors that led him to spend the majority of his life in a career with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources as a Game Warden. When he retired from the DNR in the late 80's he and Franny purchased a camper and hit the road. They traveled the country for many years before they settled down and split their time between Donna, TX and Superior. When they gave up the nomad life they put down loose roots in Dodgeville.

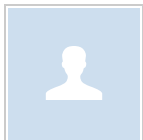

“ Dear Fran, Family and Friends: All my sympathy for your loss of one great guy, I was shocked to hear of Skip's passing. When you folks were stationed at Medford I was stationed as the warden at Park Falls. Both of us were stationed in the same work area and worked together on group checks, and other work and area meetings. I really didn't get to know skip very well until we were assigned to design and sew snowmobile covers, made from surplus GI pup tent halves at the Medford Ranger Station, for the new 12.3 Skidoo snowmobiles we were issued. This assignment was supposed to save the Department money over the purchase of factory covers that actually fit and protected the new machines. After over a week of daily work on the covers they were finished. They were the laughing stock of everyone who was issued one, as well as the general public, as they flopped around in the wind as they were trailered down the roads. During that week of construction Skip and I got to know each other very well and became life long friends. The snowmobile covers were eventually laughed off the road and trashed.
