Maxine volunteered at many church functions. The rummage sale at the UCC church was one of her favorites, especially when Aunt Minnie Tibbits was there to help. You would also find her helping at the pasty sales.

Maxine's favorite day of the year was Christmas eve when her family came to her house and had oyster stew and everyone's favorites. Games were played, there was always lots of laughter. We are thankful we were able to bring her back home to celebrate last year, the tradition will continue.

Maxine's family was truly the most important thing in her life. Maxine and Leroy had three

children: Gary (Jan Jackson), Bob (Connie Schmitz), and Diane (Bruce Whitford). She was so proud of her children. She loved that they all lived in Mineral Point and Gary and Bob farmed on the family farm. Her grandchildren and great grandchildren were truly blessed to call her Gram. She would be front row at every sporting or school event. She never missed a Grandparents Day or Christmas program at the Mineral Point elementary school. She would be there an hour before to save seats for her special crew. She picked up her grandchildren, great grandchildren and Boone and Logan Schmitz from the elementary school every day. She always a plate of cookies waiting for them. The highlight of many kids' day was walking up to the bus to receive a hug from "Grandma Max" as what she was called by many.

Her "Mineral Point News," brought so many together in our community. It gave her great joy to know everyone read it. She reported birthdays and told events that occurred with her family and friends.
