Schmidt of Linden, father Richard, daughters Raffica (Ben Gollmer) and Joan (James Doyle), step-son David (Kait) McCullough, three grandchildren Preston, Danica, and Zoe McCullough, his siblings Theresa, Mary (Stephen) Ostop, Thomas, and Dolores (John) Paeth, and countless friends. He was a great father who taught his daughters and step-son innumerable practical skills and always encouraged them to follow their dreams. He is forever loved and will be deeply missed.

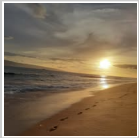
