Dodgeville – Nancy L. Ladd, age 83, of Dodgeville, died on Sunday, December 29, 2019 at Upland Hills Nursing & Rehab Center in Dodgeville.

She was born on January 29, 1936 in Dodgeville, a daughter of Stanley and Myrtle (Severson) Jacobson. She graduated from Dodgeville High School.

Nancy is survived by her husband Dave; her children Jeff (Liz Heimerl) Ladd of Dodgeville, Sandy (Tom) Bartelt of Mt. Horeb, Chris (Kathy) Ladd of Dodgeville; her granddaughters Hannah Bartelt and Emma Ladd; her siblings Joyce Kieslich-Widder, Robert (Mary) Jacobson, Jerry (Dianne) Jacobson and Larry Jacobson; many nieces, nephews, other relatives and friends.

She was preceded in death by her son Scott, her parents, and her brother, Donald.
