Her other favorite pastimes included coloring, doing crossword puzzles, and playing Bingo, Phase 10, and Rummikub with her friends.

Time with her family was cherished - whether going on adventures, out to eat, or just being together for special occasions such as weddings, birthdays, and holidays. She will be remembered for her thoughtfulness, care and contagious laughter. She will be greatly
