Dodgeville – Scott Alan Sullivan, age 45, of Dodgeville, passed away on Wednesday, April 11, 2012 at his home with his loving wife by his side, following a long, ferocious and courageous battle with melanoma cancer.

Scott was born on October 30, 1966 to Robert and Esther (Anderson) Sullivan. He graduated from Dodgeville High School in 1985 and started working in the bowling business and never left. Scott worked and bowled at many of the bowling alleys in Southwest Wisconsin. His passion was to help people become better bowlers and to enjoy it for the sake of the game. He made an immeasurable number of friends through bowling and loved them all. By the time Scott had to end his bowling career because of health reasons, he had achieved thirty 300 games and twelve 800 series.

Scott's other passion in life was his family. He married Darci Nielsen in 1996 and together they had three beautiful daughters which were his pride and joy. He left his family with many wonderful memories of fishing, golf carting, trips to the petting zoo, rides in the countryside and fun around the fire pit. Family trips to the cabin were always a favorite.

Scott is survived by his wife, Darci; his daughters, Alyssa (12), Emily (9) and Carley (5); his brothers, Jim Sullivan, of Dodgeville, Dan (Diane) Sullivan, of Wausau and Tom (Kadie) Sullivan, of Rothschild; his sister, Kathy (Loren)
